## intro: Just as good as wheat paste

A different way to make paste that is way easier than wheat paste recipes and it is just as good. Benefits of this are that it doesn't stink while being stored, you don't need to refrigerate it, and it's made from household materials you probably won't even spend any money in the production of, yeah, and it's super fast to make and use when using it on the streets it never needs to be stirred again after it was stirred in production.

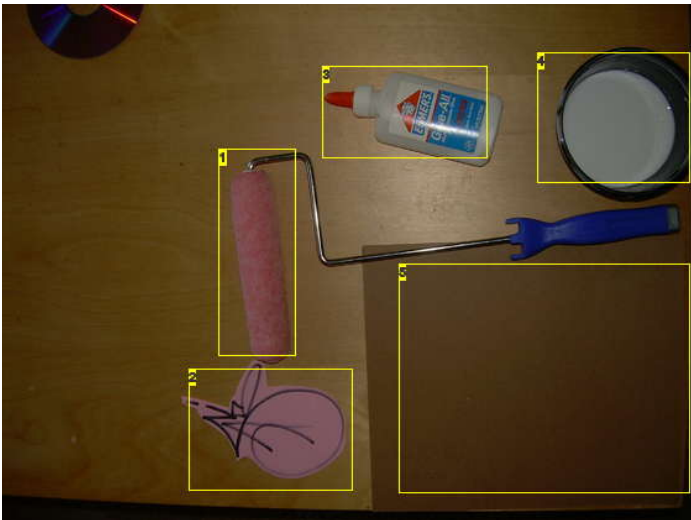
*In 1990, the University of Washington measured the holding power of various adhesives:*

Adhesive Peel Test  
Rice Paste 7.9 lbs  
Wheat Paste 8.1 lbs  
White Glue (full strength) 7.5 lbs  
White Glue (diluted 1:1 with water) 8.1



## step 1: Materials

Roller or Paintbrush  
Permanent Marker  
Paper  
container  
White Glue  
Water



### Image Notes

1. Roller
2. paper
3. White glue
4. Container holding final mixture
5. Cardboard to test the mixture out

## step 2: Mix it and Stir

Mix water with glue at a 1:1 ratio

*Be aware not to put too much water or else it wont be very sticky*

**ITS ALWAYS BETTER TO HAVE TOO LITTLE THAN TOO MUCH IN THIS CASE**

Stir it up with something until it is mixed and not still seperated

*When you pull out the whatever you use to stir it u want it to be sticky thats a sighn of a good mixture*



## step 3: Roll

Now **Roll** the paste on to your surface put enough paste for the size of your paper



## step 4: Stick it

Place your paper on the area where you rolled the paste

*Make sure you keep wrinkles and air bubbles out if you dont people can take it off easier and it looks ugly*

**sometimes depending on your paper** while it is wet it looks like wrinkles are everywhere but when it dries you can't see them

Now put a light coat of paste over your paper *To make sure nobody can take it down without putting in way more work than it took for you to put it up*



### step 5: Bam

Your done hopefully your work stays up for a long time
