What is this?

This workshop is aimed at year 6 primary school children in their year before transition to secondary school. The session is facilitated at the school by one police officer and lasts between 45 minutes to an hour. The workshop is based around decision making and the consequences that occur as a result of those decisions. The session poses the children various moral dilemmas: They are then encouraged to make decisions, either to agree or disagree with the statement made by the facilitator and then discuss their views. The workshop also outlines three true stories regarding three different characters. The story is told of two brothers, Sylvester (Sy) and Jethro (Jet) who live on a local estate with their mother and younger sister. Jet is the brother who makes all the wrong decisions in his young life and faces the consequences and Sy makes all the right decisions and reaps the benefits. The third story relates to a mystery character that makes a few wrong decisions but manages to change his way of life and eventually his identity is

revealed. The session is designed for the children to be interactive with the content and to show the importance of making the right decisions over the moral dilemmas that they are presented with.

Why is it useful?

To demonstrate to young people the importance of making the right decisions over moral dilemmas.
